

Epsilon Zeta Alumni Association Meeting
Sage 4101, RPI, Troy, NY October 26, 1986

Vice-president Steve Flood called the meeting to order at 11:22 AM.

At the time of the meeting, 26 Alumni had attended all or part of the Reunion weekend.

Tim Shaughnessy was declared the winner of the individual Man-Mile award, and the New York Metropolitan Area Regional Alumni Branch (NYMARAB) was declared the winner of the group Man-Mile award.

The Association elected its new officers:

A motion to reimburse John Lebron for purchased but unused baseball tickets passed.

A motion to have the new President remove his hat passed.

The Association paused in its deliberations to congratulate Steve Flood on the birth of his son.

A motion to institute a Distinguished Alumni Award, to be given at the five-year Anniversaries to people who have promoted the Association, passed. The Executive Committee at the time of the Anniversary will decide who should receive the award.

The Association discussed the sending of post cards announcing on-campus reunions to all Association members; the consensus was that the post cards should be sent to all Association Members.

The Association discussed organizing trips and other EZAA activities. The consensus was that people interested in organizing such activities are encouraged to do so, and to place announcements in the newsletter.

The Association discussed the events planned for the 40th Anniversary Reunion. The wine and cheese reception will be held on Friday in the Chapel and Cultural Center. The project on Saturday has not yet been decided; ideas include working at the RPI Technology Park and holding a fair or other activity for handicapped children. Tours of campus could be run by the RPI tour guides, or current Brothers could give tours of their laboratories; a self-guided walking tour of Troy could be arranged through the Troy Chamber of Commerce. Ideas for entertainment at the banquet on Saturday included a

disc jockey, a folksinger, and a juggler or some other visual entertainment.

The Association discussed other matters relating to the 40th Anniversary. Formal invitations will be sent in January. Paul Sicard volunteered to obtain souvenirs for the Anniversary. The Time Capsule is in need of memorabilia of the first 40 years of Epsilon Zeta Chapter. The Association felt that the service display, to be placed in one of the Alumni Office buildings, was an appropriate symbolic gift, and felt that a plaque should be produced for presentation at the 40th Anniversary if the full display were not ready or an appropriate place was not available for it. Tim Kelliher volunteered to put together a slide show; slides showing Epsilon Zeta activities over its first 40 years. In order to accommodate families returning for the 40th Anniversary, blocks of rooms in local motels should be reserved.

A motion to increase the 40th Anniversary budget by \$600.00 passed.

A motion to create a Member-at-Large budget of \$50.00 per year, to be used for Historian-related material, passed.

President Steve Flood adjourned the meeting at 12:54 PM.
